Birth Can be Dismal for Black Women. What This Hospital is **Doing to Stop that**

In a country where maternal death rates are higher than any other high-income nation in the world and Black women are at a statistically higher risk for complications, Los Angeles' MLK Community Hospital decided to do something different in the labor room. Women are guided through childbirth with the expertise and care of certified nurse midwives, with obstetricians on call to support high risk and emergency cases. This approach, which focuses on reducing C-sections and providing personalized care, has reduced unnecessary and often dangerous surgical intervention by almost 10%. The hospital's practices demonstrate the power of targeted and empathetic health solutions for promoting health equity and leading peace innovation.

Last week, Major League Soccer (MLS) introduced a new anti-discrimination policy focused on implementing restorative practices when faced with cases of player-to-player racism and other forms of discrimination. The new approach will include counseling, education programs, and confidential meetings with trained facilitators to propose action plans for a more impactful resolution. As a collaborative effort between the MLS, MLS Players Association, and the Black Players for Change group, the announcement represents a growing commitment to move away from pure suspension-based policies and towards discipline with opportunities for reconciliation and change. 


Giants: Art from the Dean Collection of Swizz Beatz and Alicia Keys
