Equal education, unequal pay: Why is there still a gender pay gap in 2024?

A recent U.S. Census Bureau report revealed a disappointing, but perhaps expected finding: women earn about 71 cents to a dollar compared to men, regardless of educational attainment. This persistent gender pay gap, present even among highly educated individuals, hints at systemic issues beyond mere occupational choices or working hours, including ingrained gender stereotypes and discrimination. The statistics demonstrate that the disparity is particularly pronounced for Black and Hispanic women and intensifies during prime childbearing years. As we reflect on these findings, we are struck by the critical nature of PII's commitment to gender equality and economic empowerment as foundational pillars for sustainable peace and innovation. Peace cannot be built except with all human beings of all genders on board, paving the way towards a better future through our combined brilliance.

How women's rights fared in the past year

On International Women's Day, U.N. Secretary-General António Guterres highlighted the global backlash against women's rights, urging accelerated action toward gender equality. Meanwhile, devastating conflicts, notably the Israel-Gaza war, have disproportionately affected women, with reports of significant casualties, displacements, and sexual violence. In the U.S., the polarized debate on abortion rights continues, reflecting wider global tensions around women's reproductive freedoms. Efforts in France and Mexico to protect abortion access provide a contrast to restrictive measures elsewhere. As we continue to work together towards gender equality, this article is a reminder that achieving sustainable peace and innovation worldwide cannot happen without bold efforts to empower all women with the networks and resources to lead transformative change.


Women Economic Forum New York March 8th, 2024
